Chair's Report

Operation Toilets Australia Inc. (OTA) is an advocacy and changemaker entity with a focus on behavioural change as part of water, sanitation, and health projects in the developing world. Our core purpose continues to be to encourage behavioural change in schools with the Wash in Schools (WinS) program in India and in the community in Ethiopia with the Community Led Total Sanitation and Health (CLTSH) program. Our focus in schools has the special aim to improve the educational opportunities of adolescent girls and in the community to improve the overall health of all family members. OTA is a project of the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central.

2023-2024 saw the successful completion of the CTLSH Global Grant project in the Shurmo Region of Central Ethiopia, OTA's first major project in collaboration with International Needs Australia following the small Direct Grant in West Rukum, Nepal in 2023. Based on the success of the Shurmo project, OTA, in collaboration with INA commenced development, of a similar project in Ethiopia's Ehza District with a new funding model utilizing INA's access to DFAT matching.

The Delhi 1 Global Grant was also closed off after delays due to COVID while the other Delhi Projects are still to be closed off.

Thanks to all the members of the Operation Toilets Australia committee who have contributed to the ongoing success of OTA projects in 2023-24. A special thanks to past Chair Amanda Southwell for her leadership and encouragement as well as other retiring members Don Sweeney and Angela Magut. We were pleased to welcome Bianca Lobo and Thilan Koththigoda to the Committee.

We would like to acknowledge the continued financial support and goodwill conveyed by Rotarians, Rotary clubs, Rotary districts, individuals and organisations in Australia, India, USA, Canada and the UK who have donated substantial funds to our projects since inception.

First year of a 3-year CTLSH program in the Ezha District within the Gurage Zone of Central Ethiopia in collaboration with International Needs Australia (INA) with Rotary funds matched through INA/DFAT.

Discussions and project development commenced with INA. Project is scheduled to commence in early 2024-2025 RY. Loaded to RI Service Project Centre.

MARKETING & COMMUNICATIONS

There has been an increased focus on a proactive marketing and communications approach for OTA in the last 6 months of FY24. One outcome of this was a range of visual improvements to the OTA website, with the aid of an independent marketing contractor, Jahangir Kapadia from Light Shadow Studio. The website updates included changes to colour schemes, fonts, background images and menu functionality. The updates ensured greater consistency across the website ahead of the Rotary International Convention in Singapore, as potential donors would be directed to the website for more information.

Another significant outcome was that the OTA Committee resolved to form a Marketing and Communication Subcommittee to institute a more sustainable donor engagement model. Up till that point, a responsive approach was in place, highly dependent on committee member, Mark Balla. The Subcommittee was officially formed following the April Committee meeting, with Thilan Koththigoda and Bianca Lobo acting as members. An annual marketing and communications strategy was created over May and June, based on an analysis of current donor data. The strategy outlined tactics and calendar of activity from July 2024 to June 2025, aiming to utilise a broad range of skills and resources to engage current and potential donors. The OTA Committee is involved in approving all developing aspects of the strategy and remains as overseer of marketing activity and expenditure.

Project Funding

Even though the total turnover of OTA projects has reached AUD\$1,484,308 as of the 30 June 2024 the scale of this activity is not reflected in the financial statement as the majority of donated funds are paid directly to a particular Global Grant account by the donors rather than being channeled through the OTA bank account, These transfers are coordinated by OTA, acting as the International Host (via the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central), in its role as project "broker" to ensure that all agreed donations are transferred to the specific Global Grant account once the project has been approved. Ethiopia Shurmo GG2091874 Outcomes

Toilet Construction

- Artisan and vendors groups organized and supported by training and materials
- 157 households improved latrines constructed (partially subsidised by beneficiaries)
- 83 existing toilets rehabilitated
- Three improved latrines (for girls) constructed at three primary schools
- Six pit latrines constructed in six villages (roadside latrines)
- Five schools supported on how to make plans for building improved latrines

Education and Training

- Communication strategies between vendors and consumers developed (latrine products market linkage developed)
- Information, Education and Communication (IEC) and Behavioural Change Communication (BCC) materials and banners produced in the local language and promoting achievements to increase motivation
- Quarterly and annual review meetings organized
- Multi-stakeholder meetings conducted
- Train the Trainer training on CLTSH planning, monitoring and evaluation provided to 30 sector office personnel
- Training on CLTSH approaches provided to 140 volunteer health promoters
- Training on CLTSH approaches provided to 156 school club members
- Training on CLTSH approaches provided to 24 health extension workers
- Training on CLTSH approaches, Community Conversation and monitoring and evaluation provided to 60 Natural leaders, Religious Leaders and Kebele Administrators
- Training on WASH and CLTSH provided to 108 school teachers and PTA members
- Six CLTSH task forces trained on CLTSH approaches and facilitated the CLTSH implementation
- 90 students and teachers involved in ignition events to support household and community hygiene promotion; engage community and HHs in community conversations and family dialogues
- Ignition/walk of shame events at four villages and five primary schools
- Sector offices advocated to show commitments to WASH achievements and district sector offices (education, health and water offices) were able to develop strategic plan on WASH activities
- Community conference, sanitation and hygiene promotion campaigns organised at four kebeles and five primary schools and 70,000 people reached through mass awareness educations
- Project staff tracked and monitored post ignition Water, Hygiene and Sanitation practices at community, household and school levels
- Training on community and resource mobilization provided to seven CLTSH committees to enable them establish effective rewarding mechanisms to sustain changes
- Experience sharing events organised for government staff, natural leaders and CLTSH committee members
- Achievements dissemination, certification and rewarding events carried out for incentivising as well as scaling up interventions

Enhanced protection and management of water sources

- Organize mass public awareness creation events organized in cooperation with school clubs and other local actors on keeping Water sources tidy and avoid contamination, and safe water storage
- Training on management of water source provided to 13 rural water comm

The Global Grant funding process:

- OTA as the "International Sponsor" Rotary club, develops a project plan with an in-country "Host Sponsor" Rotary club.
- A Community Needs Assessment is undertaken by the Host Sponsor.
- A Global Grant application is then developed online, based on the Community Needs Assessment.
- Donation commitments are sort from Rotary clubs and Rotary districts worldwide by OTA (on behalf of the International Sponsor the Rotary Club of Box Hill Central) and the Host Sponsor.
- Once donation commitments are confirmed, the grant application is submitted for approval.
- On approval of the grant, OTA advises Rotary clubs to transfer their donation to the particular Global Grant account and Rotary districts are advised by the Rotary Foundation to transfer their Designated District Funds to the global grant account which is matched 80% by the Rotary Foundation.
- Once all donations are received, the Rotary Foundation transfers the project funds to the nominated Host Sponsor or International Sponsor clubs or both allowing the project to commence.
